You may have heard that changes are coming to Arkansas Works. We are sending this information to help you get ready.

Work Requirement

- Starting **June 1, 2018**, some people who get Arkansas Works will have to do 80 hours of work activities each month to keep their health insurance. Those people will have to report work activities to DHS online at access.arkansas.gov.
- In the future, you will receive additional notice if you are subject to the work requirement along with information on how to report any exemptions for which you may qualify.

What You Need to Do

- Call 1-855-372-1084 to give us an email address. You must have an email address to report work requirement information.
- Check your mail often for letters from DHS. Read your mail as soon as you receive it.
- If you receive a notice and do not understand what to do, call the number on the notice for help.

Referrals for Programs for Specific Needs:

- Free GED and free English as a Second Language classes.
- Programs tailored to assist veterans with employment needs.
- Help for workers who have lost a job because of international trade.
- Temporary cash assistance for needy families (TANF/TEA).
- Vocational rehabilitation for Arkansans living with a disability.
- Programs for young people.
